**DANGEROUS LOW-FLYING BY MILITARY AIR-
 CRAFT OVER AND AROUND THE VILLAGE.**
 Wing Conunander "**Bill**" Newby has been **advised** by
 MOD(AIR) that the new public phone number for complaints
 about low and potentially dangerous flying is now 020 7218
 6020. which may be dialled direct to whitehall. All calls will
 now be recorded and investigated and a letter will be sent in
 reply. **DO NOT TELEPHONE** RAF St. MAWGAN. They
 cannot help - because most low **flying** is below their radar
 range in this area. In making a complaint **plcasc:-**
 (a) Give **your** name address and telephone number.
 (b) Quote this **Ordanance** Survey **Location number** - SX 285 S04
 (Lewaruuck)
 (c) Give time and nwnber of **Aircraft**
 (d) Try to say in which direction they flew over the Village.
 (e) **Say** whether they were fighter - type jet aircmfi, Le. noisy/fast
 (f) Or were they slow, heavy, multi engines i.e. Transports
 (g) **AND** whether you were frightened/worried/scared, etc.
 For some time now MOD has cancelled specific low flying
 areas which **means** that all of U.K. (except large Towns), is
 subject to low flying to help train aircrew. But areas are
 switched about as complaints increase in anyone area - more
 complaints means less over-flying. Most low flying is done **by**
 RAF; USAF; Gennan Air Force & NATO planes using our
 airspace. Gennany long since refused the RAF & USAF the
 right to fly low over Genuany - it was said 'to frighten the
 horses'. Helicopters and small RN & RAF communications
 aircmft. or commercial planes. e.g. BRYMON, flying at
 1000ft, are not considered to be a nuisance and MOD do not
 wish to know.

As far as I know this will be the last Newsboy, and I want to concentrate **my thoughts** on your **expanding** business. This will be in the area of employing people. The reason for employing people is largely **because** you, as the owner or manager of a business, can only do a certain amount of work in a **given** time, be that a minute or a month. Any extra work which must be done, must be performed by someone else. **That** person may be a relative or a stranger. **As** I am not qualified to discuss working **practices**, I must refer you to **the** Department of Education and Employment who will **give** you brief advice and some booklets - both free usually. Take their advice and their booklets and learn them by heart. For the moment however you are facing a **problem** of wanting someone to **help you** out, and that someone doesn't know **anything** about your business - or does he/she? If you look at the problem, you will discover that you are the person who is producing the idea and that other people will initially help you out in other fairly standard situations. For example, a Bookkeeper or Accountant work in a fairly standard, conventional way, because their work must be understood by others in their trade or profession and generally in all **universal** professions. However, you are the one who makes "Widgets", so any other professions can essentially be hired or contracted out to people who are already employed doing their chosen work. As there are basically only three elements to all businesses; production, marketing and accounting, you can **sub-contract** two of them out and work at the third yourself. It is totally essential to remember that you are the best at doing something you know about, so leave everything else to people who know what they are doing.
