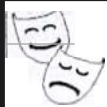

TOP FORM FOR LEWANNICK SCHOOL

Top **marks** for the quality of teaching have been given to Lewannick Primary School by Government Inspectors. Also highlighted in the Ofsted (Office for standards in Education) report were the very good behaviour of pupils and their attitudes towards learning, plus the backing given by Parents and the local community. In the report it was noted that good **progress** had been made since the last inspection and concludes that the School is well placed to make further improvements and meet its targets. "The school has a **very** good ethos which emphasises high standards," say the authors of the **report**, equality of opportunity and the personal development of all in the school. The report goes on to say that the pupils feel valued and well supported by everyone including support **staff**, lunchtime assistants, the **Caretaker** and the **School Secretary**. The Head Teacher provides good leadership with clear aims for the School which focus on **high standards** and the best possible educational provision for all pupils. The report also added that relationships between all **staff** and parents were very good. The **Inspectors** also identified **areas** of action for Governors & **staff**. To improve the rate of progress and raise standards in writing at key stage one. To improve the rate of progress and raise standards in information **technology** control, monitoring and modelling at key stage two.

Head Teacher Mr. J. Caudle said "The school inspection was rigorous and intensive. The **Inspectors** findings supported my view that ours is a friendly, happy school with many strengths. The pupils are well motivated and achieve their potential including those with special **needs** and exceptional abilities. I would like to thank **staff**, **governors**, parents and members of the wider community for their contributions to the children's education at this school. The school works closely in partnership with local businesses and Cornwall & Devon **Careers** to make the children's education enjoyable and meaningful. The school is fortunate that the commitment and support of staff, parents and other of **the** school community enable the children to have many **extra** curricular opportunities. These together with the outdoor education and **adventure** activities on **offer** contribute to the high quality of education **recognised** by the Inspectors." Chair of Governon Barbara Sleep said "The Inspector's ha"e **recognised** that this is a very good school. I would like to thank the excellent Head teacher and **Staff** team who, supported by the Governors, enable the school to provide the pupils with a high standard of education. We have happy, well behaved children, the result of the strong motivation, moral and personal education provided by **staff**. The teaching of personal effectiveness skills in this school has led to National recognition through the Investors in **Careers** pilot scheme. The **areas** for improvement are **comparatively** minor and have been addressed immediately. The Governors action plan will be issued later this term giving details of how this is happening. The current position in the school, providing as it does a high standard of education for all pupils is something for which I feel proud Mr Caudle, the Governors, Staff, Parents and Children should share in this pride. We are well placed to progress into the next millennium with confidence."
