Lewannick Parish Council met on Thursday 22 June at 20.00 hrs at Polyphant Village Hall. Many of you will have observed the works recently being carried out on the parish clock. A restorer has used a bosun chair to reach the top of the tower to overhaul and repair the dial motion work and clock movement. We have decided to continue with this restoration project and the two clock dials will be completely overhauled, painted and finished with gold leaf. The possibility of working jointly with CCC about traffic speeding limits are also being investigated. Meanwhile, we would ask you all to watch your speeds at Lewannick particularly when bringing and collecting children from the school. We have also received complaints from residents at Polyphant. Traffic going through Polyphant towards I-licks Mill at dangerous speeds. **Please** slow down.

Planning: We received no planning applications. However, we were pleased to receive a VAT refund of £905.02 of which a large percentage relates to the bus shelter at Lewannick.

Japanese Knotweed Survey

The total area of knotweed recorded for Cornwall are approx. 80 hectares (200 acres). It is clear that there are still large areas that are unrecorded. If you are aware of a site could you please let us know. Whilst notification will not automatically mean that it will be treated, it will greatly assist in identifying priority sites and coordinating control measures with participating bodies. It will also be used to demonstrate the scale of the problem when seeking funding for control work. If you know of a site then please telephone us, preferably with an OS location number, so that we can report our findings.
