NEW MEMBERS ALWAYS WELCOME

LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL met on 29 September at Polyphant Village Hall.

A deposit draft from C C C had been circulated prior to the meeting for consultation purposes on the strategic assessment of the Waste Local Plan and to consider not **only** environmental but also social and economic impacts. It was concluded that we would reply stating that it is essential that we push for an incineration plant as soon as possible. A suitable location would be Innis Down or Indian Queens.

There was one planning application Number 2000/1437 by Mr & Mrs G Tucker, Barn S.E. of Tinney Hall Farm, Lewannick. Change of use from redundant single storey barn, including erection of extension to the Nonh, to form residential dwelling. The application stated it would be connected to the main sewer. As there is a sewerage embargo within the Parish the application was not supported: an alternative drainage system would need to be implemented.

Two applications have been approved by NCDC.

Mr Tucker, erection of Agricultural livestock building (No 2000/1067) and Mr Fuge, Yew Trees, erection of garage/tool shed (No 2000/1308)

The following payments were made: **grass** cutting £382.50, cleaning bus shelter £25.85, BT £52.26, Tayor Made (play **equipment**, Polyphant) £545 and Ellis Landscapes £500.00
