LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL Met on Thursday 27th
September at Lewannick Village Hall. The meeting commenced at
7.30 pm with a minutes silence as a mark of respect for the terrible
attacks on New York on September 11th.

The Chairman welcomed a number of the public who attended the
first part of our meeting when the Queens Jubilee was discussed
under the Chairmanship of Mr Ken Hocking. A committee was
established which will meet again on 13th November. If anyone

Among other business for discussion by L P C we have received a
plan from Cornwall County Council that show a stopping-up of the
Two Bridges Picnic Site. This will imply a right turn ban into Old
Hill, Lewannick and a one-way system. We have objected to this
proposal stating that we object until the Plusha Underpass is built. A
copy of the proposed plan is available for inspection on the Polyphant
notice-board, a copy will also be available at Lewannick Post Office.
Application 2001/1446. erection of detached double garage to replace
single garage at 14, Medrow, Polyphant for Mr & Mrs A Murphy has
been supported by L.I.C.
