A Public meeting was held on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> November at Darkes Court, Polyphant by kind permission of Mr D Sowerby. The meeting was well attended and a number of suggestions were put forwards on how we might celebrate this special day. Lewannick Parish Council met at Polyphaot Hall on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> November at 8.00 pm. There were a number of documents received including Cornwall Waste Local Plan Enquiry, Cornwall Structure Plan Review Proposals Paper, NCDC - Requirement for Parish Councillors to adopt a Local Code of Conduct and finally DEFRA - Quality Parish & Town Councils - a consultation paper. All are being circulated to Councillors. Finances included working out our precept for 2002/03 which we have set at £31.00 per household. Invoices for payment included £956.62 for cutting the grass within the parish/aggregate for pan of a path on Polyphant Green and £30 for production of this newsletter.

Bodmin Moor Employment Action Support Team have written to us to enlist our help in promoting their aims to help individuals to return to work within our area. The project aims to help all jobless people aged 16 - 65. The people the project aims to help may not be claiming benefit of any type and may never have used jobcentres.
