LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

met at Lewannick Village Hall on Thurs. 17th Jan. Parish Councils are currently the subject of review and formal discussions with the local Government Assoc. National Assoc. of Local Councils and the Countryside Agency are taking place. Quality Parish Councils will work loosely in partnership with their principal authorities and, through their enhanced role, give their communities a better deal on local services and a stronger voice in the decisions which affect peoples lives. The papers that were circulated to our Councillors were discussed. The Local Govrnt Act 2000 has also introduced a new ethical framework for local government. This provides that all relevant authorities should adopt a code of conduct based on a model code issued by DETR. Local Govrnt. and the Regions. It was the opinion of some councillors that the new undertakings may make it more difficult to get new councillors in the future. However, we wish to apply to become a Quality PC in order to apply for the grants and have as much "clout" as possible for the benefit of our Parish. We have also applied for the Local Maintenance Partnership 2002/3 which means we will work in partnership with CCC for the maintenance and up-keep of public footpaths.
