LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Met at Lewannick Village Hall on Thurs. 21 February at 8.00 pm. There were three planning applications for discussion. all of which were supported. 1) Mr W B Retallack. Barn (South East Tinney Hall, erection of detached single garage 2) Mr & Mrs Acaster, listed building consent for conversion of barn into dwelling, Meadow Barn, Knighton, Plusha and 3) Mr & Mrs Moore, Hollyvag. Continued use of land for the tipping of waste and stone extraction for motor cycle practising for which temporary permission was granted previously.

REFUSE: Despite warnings within our newsletter this is becoming a problem and according to the Environmental Health leaving refuse outside your property for more than 24 hours before collection is classified as **FLY TIPPING** and can result in a fine of up to £1000. Any residents who persist will now receive a standard letter from Environmental Health, this will be followed by inspections and if the offender(s) persist the fine will be set. Unfortunately we have had reason to report an offender within our parish following written complaints from residents.
