LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Met at Lewannick Village Hall on Thursday 21st March. There were two planning applications which were supported: Mr T B Ellis, Medrow bungalow; erection of two polytunnels to be used for the growing of plants in connection with a horticultural business. Mr B J Balsden. Trewanta Hall Farm Listed building consent for renewing roof. Cheques were drawn for photocopying newsletter £30 and a grant to Polyphant Youth Club £120. We have been in correspondence with CCC Highways and it is hoped that Lewannick will get a rural speed limit of 30 mph which is due for consideration by April 2002. The section of road from Trevadlock to Lewannick is marked for repair and the bridge by Strayer Park Far, Trevell and Finches bridge has been inspected and repairs will be carried out in the near future. Our next meeting will be at Polyphant on Thursday 18th April at 20.00 hrs

LEWANNICK CP SCHOOL

The following question was “Please may the subject of road safety be re-addressed again?”

The following response has been sent out to all parents.

Advice was obtained from the Health & Safety Officer, CCC. The advice was that we should instruct parents to keep speeds to a minimum when driving in and out of the school and that we should speak to individuals who persistently drive at speed or who park inconsiderately. To ease the problem, ask parents to make every effort to park in the village hall car park. If we prevent parents from parking in the school car park we will only transfer the problem to the residential road. Please only park on one side of the road as the Emergency Services may need access. Please respect the access for residents to their own driveways. We hope to mark out parking spaces to ensure maximum capacity

SHELTER FOR POLYPHANT

Over the past few months the Parish Council in collaboration with the Methodist Church have been thoroughly investigating the viability of a Lych Gate type structure over the entrance gates to the Chapel which is where the buses normally stop. This scheme overcomes previous site problems and is environmentally suited to the Chapel and to the Polyphant Conservation Area. Quotation for plans are now being evaluated and at the same time Highways are being consulted. There is still a long way to go but we hope to keep residents informed by periodic reports
