LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Following the success of the Lewannick Golden Jubilee day, there was a surplus of £1476.92 and the Committee decided to dispose of it as follows:

£1000 to War Memorial Restoration, £245 for a seat on Polyphant Green, £115.91 to Polyphant play area and a

similar amount to Polyphant Youth Club for equipment

The results of the decorated window or building comp:

1st M S Lindsay, Bovetown Cottage. 2nd C Bunbury,

Fonthill Cottages, 3rd J Eno at Pen-Inney Cottage.

Lewannick Parish Council met on Thurs. 18th July. After reviewing responses received for prospective candidates for

co-option, a confidential vote took place. Mr M Day of The

Villa, Polyphant has now been co-opted onto the Council

and replaces our former Councillor Mr K Hocking. A manage-

ment committee is being set up between the Parish Council

and Lewannick Primary School in order to oversee the

playing area. Cllr John Newbery was pleased to report that

there was a significant improvement in care being taken by teenagers using the location after school hours.

Our Chairman reported that a start had been made on the

war memorial and it is our aim to have restoration

completed by November. The speeding limit review was

discussed and it was agreed that we would ask Highways to

extend the 30 mph speed signs with a sign being located at

two Bridges rather than near Sunnybank, Polyphant.
