LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL held their monthly meeting at Lewannick on Thursday 19 September. The chairman began by welcoming Mike Day of The Villa, Polyphant onto our Council. It was reported that works on the War Memorial are progressing well. Two quotes were submitted for erecting the new base. It was agreed that we accept the quote from Tony Cayzer @ £2114.00. The Chairman reported that we were tight on time if we hope to have the Memorial restored for the Remembrance Service. However, a contingency plan, which has been agreed with the Church and Chapel means that if necessary, the wreath can be laid by the war memorial screen inside the Church. Plans for an "amenity shelter" to be located on the green, Polyphant were distributed and approved. We have been in correspondence with CCC, Planning, Highways and indeed the CAB all of whom support the principal.

Plans for discussion, all of which were supported were as follows: 2002/11817 Mr & Mrs A Cayzer No 1 The Row, Polyphant listed building consent for the erection of two-storey extension comprising kitchen/dining room with bedroom and shower over. 2202/1779 Mr & Mrs W T Sowerby, conversion of single storey barn into multi function business facility and A30 Two Bridges Layby - proposed right turn ban for eastbound A30 traffic. Cheques for payment were Bruce Deighton £320 for tree work at Lewannick, audit commission £237.94. Brian Stringer (footpaths) £70. BSU cleaning of Lewannick Bus Shelter £22.00. Ben Mc Manigan (Potter) £22. Copytech (newsletter) £60 for two months and Trevadlock cemetery church Trust £350 for urgent works on cutting limbs off trees on the public highway. It was agreed that we would invite Bruce Deighton to do a further report on trees on Polyphant Green and to give us his recommendations for the next three years. The seat outside Polyphant Chapel has been damaged by a vehicle and is scheduled for repairs. The Chairman also thanked Kevin Jasper for the work he had done in repairing the play equipment at Lewannick and for his generosity in donating both his time and the materials required. REMEMBER to use the re-cycle bins outside the village hall. All items collected raises much needed funds for the village hall. Our next meeting will be at Polyphant on October 17<sup>th</sup> commencing 8.00 pm. The public are welcome to attend and the first ten minutes of all our meetings are available for the public to have their say. POLYPHANT PARK COMMITTEE would like to thank everyone who helped at the Duck race on Sunday. We raised £450.00 on the day - a tremendous success. A special thank-you to Michael and Joy White who let us use the field. The grand winners were: 1<sup>st</sup> Margory Curtis. 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter Retallack and 3<sup>rd</sup> Keith Woodridge.
