PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met at Polyphant on Thursday 16 October. The playground at Lewannick was discussed and it was agreed to give the current applicant until the second week of November to complete the repairs or alternatively we would go back to other applicants to tender.

There will be a special Remembrance Service at Lewannick Church on Sunday 9 November at 3pm, when the Rural Dean will officiate and the War Memorial will be re-dedicated. The Council invites you to this special service and warmly extends a welcome to you to join them for afternoon tea in the village hall after.

We have been in contact with the Police with regard to speeding traffic through Lewannick and also Bowden Derra following concern from residents at Polyphant at the speed in which some of the traffic enters the entrance to Bowden Derra from the green. We are also in correspondence with NCDC with regard to the Common Land at Polyphant and restrictions that are currently occurring on parts of this land.

Listed Building Consent for the replacement of windows on the front elevation of farmhouse, Trevadlock Farm was supported.

We need to remind all land owners that have hedges on the roadside that single-lane roads need to be trimmed at the passing places, junctions and blind corners to leave 200-300 mm of growth once in June and once in August. Two-lane road less than 18ft wide (no white line) need to be also trimmed in June and again in August, leaving 200-300mm of growth.

We are concerned that it is necessary to report that a hoax 999 call resulted in Launceston Fire Brigade being called out recently. The call was made from Polyphant telephone box. This is an extremely serious offence and it is up to us all to ensure that this form of behaviour never happens.

Cheques were drawn of £1,880.00 B Deighton - works carried out on trees at Polyphant, Lewannick Playgroup £75 grant towards insurance, Copytech £30.00 and BJV £22.00 for cleaning of bus shelter Lewannick.

Correspondence has been received from a resident with regard to improving public access and awareness to Blaunders Well, Lewannick. We have reported the matter to our Countryside Officer on Public Rights of Way, CCC.

We have also again communicated with Highways with regard to missing signs within Lewannick and hope that these will be replaced soon.

Finally we have had to report fly tipping to CCC at Example Cross, Lewannick. We understand that the Council will be removing the rubbish immediately. If you have heavy items of rubbish it can, of course, be taken to South Petherwin refuse tip or you can contact NCDC, Waste Disposal who will send you a form and on completion and receipt of ten pounds will collect three heavy items of furniture from your home. Please use the services that are available to help you.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Thursday 20 November 2003, 20.00hrs at Lewannick, when among the business to be discussed will be the precept for 2004/05.
