May Day

Our prayers for fine weather were answered and this year's May Day Celebrations must have been the most successful ever. The turnout was impressive and so was the dancing. The stalls were even more varied this year and it was wonderful to see so many people mixing together and really enjoying themselves. Thank you to everyone who attended, and especially to our special guest Mrs Hext, and of course to all the dancers, stallholders and everyone who helped to organise and set things out on the day and clear up afterwards.

The icing on the cake was the great evening 'do' at the Archer Arms, where everyone was in really high spirits, thanks to Nigel and Barry's excellent Karaoke/Disco. The auction of the Maypole flowers for £100 helped us to exceed our fund-raising target of £1000 by £80 (thank you Sparplas)! Profits will go to the Village Hall for renovation work.

The happy atmosphere of the afternoon and evening seems to make even more poignant the shocking events with which the day ended. Some time after midnight Phil Prout, was shot by the Police and later died. Many people in the parish had connections with Phil, as relatives, friends or neighbours so it's not surprising that his death has caused a general feeling of loss and sadness. Amid the dark cloud which has hung over the village many people have expressed to me their feeling of solidarity with Phil's family and friends. While personal details are none of our business, the conduct of the police is very much a matter of public concern.

Many people will now have been interviewed by the Independent Police Complaints Commission and both myself and others were impressed with the conduct and thoroughness of the IPCC officers. Members of the IPCC attended the Annual General Parish Council meeting on 13th May. The head of IPCC operations in Lewannick gave an eloquent and impressive presentation in which he explained that despite a call for speed, their investigations would be scrupulously thorough regardless of time taken and their final report would only be produced when they were satisfied that all the facts were incontrovertible. He was at pains to point out that unlike the old Police Complaints Commission the IPCC is a new organisation and is completely independent of the police. Because there are so many aspects to consider and so many statements to be correlated, this cannot be a quick process, so we must be patient and try to avoid making any assumptions until the report is published, which could be a matter of months.

Unfortunately, whatever the result, what has been done cannot be undone. Our thoughts are with Phil's family and friends.

Blackhill Quarry follow-up

As a result of the concerns expressed to Cornwall County Council regarding possible developments at the quarry a letter was sent to a Polyphant resident and cc'd to local councillors clarifying the position and function of the Blackhill Liaison Group. Some extracts follow:

"...In terms of membership the Group comprises elected Members of Lewannick & South Petherwin Parish Councils, Cornwall County Council and North Cornwall District Council; as well as Officers of the County Council as Mineral Planning Authority (MPA), the District Council Environmental Health Department, and finally the Quarry Operators, Tarmac Southern Ltd. ...

...one of the agreed objectives of this Group is to act as a forum for discussion between the interested parties, and consider any feedback received from the public regarding any aspect of operations at the Quarry. There are at least four distinct vehicles for local residents to communicate their views at this Group and receive feedback; either via their elected Parish Council representatives, the local County Councillor (or indeed any Member of the County Council's Planning (Development Control) Committee, or District Councillors, or via an Officer of the County Council/MPA. ...

...I would advise any comments to be received for the July meeting by the middle of June so that they may be included in my Report, however we can also report and consider comments up to the day of the Committee meeting if necessary..."

PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Parish Meeting of Lewannick Parish Council was held at Polyphant Village Hall on Thursday 13 May at 7.30 pm. Members of the public, Devon and Cornwall Police and Police Complaints Commission were in attendance. Reports from David Eno – Website for parish, Polyphant Women's Institute, Polyphant Methodist Church and Community Centre, Embroiderers' Guild, Lewannick Amateur Dramatics and Whist drives at Lewannick were submitted. Ian By now – P C C conveyed the condolences of the Commission to the family of the late Mr P Prout. A Minutes Silence was held in respect of the late Mr Prout.

Queries with regard to the review of Mineral Planning at Blackhill Quarry were discussed. Our financial report for the year ended 31 March 2004 was read out. Our expenses for the year equated to £10,403.44: - War Memorial £2,623.19, Maintenance of Polyphant Green and Lewannick Playing Area £1,846.00, Maintenance of Polyphant Green (trees) £3,072, Newsletter £360, Footpaths £271, Grants were awarded to Polyphant Church, Lewannick Church, Trevadlock Chapel, Lewannick Parish Website, Polyphant Youth Club and Lewannick Playgroup and totalled £591, Audit Commission £141, Parish Clock maintenance £90, Bus Shelter maintenance £88, Hire of halls £28, Insurance £378, Clerk's salary £900 and British Legion £14.50. Our precept for the year ended 31 March 2003 was £9,579 and for the year to 31 March 2004 £6,240. We used our reserves in order to keep our precept low for the year to 31 March 2003 and it was increased to £10,000 for the year to 31 March 2005. However, please compare to our 31 March 2003 precept. Also please note that no costs were claimed, by any Councillor/Clerk for disbursements: i.e., telephone, postage and stationery during any of the years mentioned.

Planning applications, which received our support, were: Mr A J Cayzer, 1 The Row, Polyphant, listed building consent for the erection of single storey rear extension, Mr N and Mrs J Potter, Mount Pleasant, Medrow, Polyphant: erection of conservatory and finally Mr I McCutcheon, Rose Cottage, Polyphant, demolition of existing lounge extension at first floor level on raised ground, excavate and erection of two storey extension.

Payments were made to Taylor-Made £381.88, Insurance £412.27, Polyphant Church, Trevadlock Cemetery, Lewannick Church, Lewannick Website all received grants of £100, Lewannick Play area £270.22 and Newsletter £30.

Councillors present reported that they had completed the works at the playground. Cllr P Sandercock had taken photographic evidence of the condition of the road surfaces within the parish and these have been forwarded to Highways.

Our next meeting will be held on Thursday 17 June at Lewannick.

Whitmans Weather

In our household my monthly weather report is known as the 'Rain Report' but for the last four weeks has been re-titled 'Lack of Rain Report'!

We are never satisfied - or is it just me? It's either too wet, too dry, too windy, too hot or too cold! Well at the moment it's too dry! Our water butts are empty! But for those with time to get out and enjoy it, what a wonderfully calm warm spell of weather we are having. Lovely clear mornings and magnificent sunsets. My records show some 22 dry days and only 34mm (one and three eighth inches) of rainfall in the last 'weather month' compared to May last year which was significantly wetter with 131mm and only 8 dry days. But then in April 2003 we had less than half the rainfall for the same period this year. Weather would be boring if it were accurately predictable. What say you?

I seem to recall confidently reporting last month that Summer had arrived. Well ok, perhaps I was a little premature (overlooked Spring!) but this current spell of weather may be Summer? Enjoy it whilst it lasts!!
