Lewannick's big new Autumn event

May Day or Beltain was one of two great doorways between Winter and Summer in the Celtic calendar. Now we are planning to revive the other celebration known as Samhain, which marked the end of Summer and the beginning of the dark days of Winter. The modern Americanised interpretation of this is Halloween with its pumpkins and 'trick or treat'. We intend to put these aside and recreate a festival with a more medieval feel and to hold it on October 22nd, nearer to the original date.

May Day has become one of Lewannick's most popular and successful events and although there is a fund-raising element it is mainly intended to be an enjoyable, sociable day for everyone, an excuse for a get together, a drink or two, a bit of fun.

The Samhain festival will, we hope,

be similar, but all the fun will take place at dusk or after dark. There will be a lantern procession around Lewannick, a mummers play performed in the street, medieval music and fancy dress, fire, stalls and amusements lit by lanterns, braziers with roasted chestnuts, maybe a hog roast or some form of simple country food – as many elements of the old fashioned 'fayre' as we can recreate.

LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met at Lewannick Village Hall on Thursday 21 July 2005.

We have received a consultation from BT Payphones in which they propose a planning strategy to make the payphones at Two Bridges and Lewannick cashless as a result of the lack of demand. We have replied to them proposing that Two Bridges be a cashless box but Lewannick remains a cash payphone. We have suggested this in the light of a number of payphones being made cashless within neighbouring villages. The payphone at Lewannick should, therefore, be retained.

We have supported a planning application for Mrs P Thomasson, erection of conservatory to rear of existing dwelling, Ashfield, Polyphant. The planning application for Circular at Two Bridges, Polyphant has not been supported. It is our opinion that inadequate consultation has been implemented and that it is not necessary to re-design this area with benches, picnic areas, caravan car-parking etc when there is a filling station and facilities at Plusha. It was proposed that we contact our MP on this matter together with that of the A30 Two Bridges to Kennards House – right hand turns.

We have also arranged for a public meeting on **THURSDAY 4 AUGUST at 19.30hrs** at Polyphant Village Hall to discuss Two Bridges and the A30 Two Bridges proposals. Parsons Brickerhoff, Highways and our MP have been invited.

C C C has written to us regarding Open Access Information Boards – Bodmin Moor. We have responded that we would be pleased to acquire an information board for Lewannick and Polyphant. The Lewannick board will be displayed outside the Post Office.

N C D C has sent us a questionnaire regarding the importance of local spaces. There were ten open spaces identified within our parish.

CCC has contacted us with regard to a temporary road closure on the B3257 Congdon's Shop to Coads Green. This is so that telecommunication work on or near the road can be carried out.

There will be an Ordinary Meeting of Lewannick Parish Council on Thursday 18 August at Polyphant Village Hall commencing 8pm.

Whitmans weather

In the words of Victor Meldrew ' I don't believe it !! '

A long, hot and at times very humid dry spell! The last two weeks that is. What did we do to deserve such favourable treatment - and in a County renowned for it's rainfall ? Mind you, as I settle once more to prepare WW (22nd) it's raining !

Certainly July - ie final week of June plus first three of July - has been the driest month of the last twelve although interestingly 1.5 inches of water was deposited upon us during the first half. Difficult to remember that isn't it after the last couple of weeks of glorious sunshine ? Glancing back at my record book suggests that at this time last year the farmers must have been swearing because in the comparable period some 6 inches of the wet stuff came their way! During that relative deluge however they still enjoyed 15 dry days which wasn't bad bearing in mind that the last four weeks this time round have been only slightly more favourable with 17 dry days. One thing is for certain however: we must have been blessed with rather more sunshine so far this year because as we look around us the harvest is nearly completed and we are still not into August !

I'd like to tell you things can only get better but would you believe me with your local knowledge? Well a betting man might put money on June/July/August as a quarter being better this year than last because my 'little black book' shows that in 2004 each of these three months was dampened with more than five inches of rainfall ! I don't remember that either (which will be no surprise to those with any knowledge of my memory!!).
