If you have been the victim of a crime or you have any information relating to a crime any of the above representatives will be happy to hear from you and will give you help and support if they can. Leaflets about crime prevention and improving home security are available from this office.

Our watch scheme receives crime information via an automated telephone system. Unfortunately the data protection Act prevents us from publishing names or this information in the Newsletter or on the parish website. We are able to publish descriptions of intruders or warnings about particular types of crime in the area.

As a member of a Neighbourhood watch scheme you are much less likely to become a victim of crime. Your home insurance premiums may be lower because you are in

a Neighbourhood Watch area.

Watch schemes have been shown to be effective in reducing burglary, deterring bogus callers and bringing down the fear of crime, and can create an active local community which is more committed to looking out for each other, supporting vulnerable neighbours and caring for the immediate environment.

Please display a neighbourhood watch sticker prominently. These are available free from the Post Office in Lewannick or from Derek (number above). We are hoping to renew the metal road signs advertising Neighbourhood Watch shortly.

Common sense precautions

- Don't answer the door to strangers.
- If you are visited by officials from any organisation ask to see their identification.
- Lock doors and close windows when you go out, even if just going next door or out in the garden.
- Don't forget to lock garages, sheds, and cars too.
- Keep keys and valuables in a safe place, out of sight
- Never keep large sums of money at home
- Beware of letting people you do not know inside your property
- Consider buying timer switches to activate lights automatically when you are out and create the impression you are at home.

LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met at Polyphant Village Hall on Wednesday 18 October. We had invited representatives from Highways to our meeting in order to push forward the conditions at Two Bridges and the Picnic Site. We were pleased to learn that draft proposals for the Picnic Site include moving the exit of the proposed bridge away from the dual carriageway and the implementation of a roundabout. Both were proposals we had put forward during the course of our initial meeting with Highways. With regard to the conditions at Two Bridges this is now in the hands of CCC Planning and Highways Legal Department. We have written to Planning in the hope of obtaining some form of dates but it is understood that work should commence during the course of this financial year.

Planning applications which were supported included: 2006/01821 Charmwell Farm, Coombeshead: Stephen Penhale - erection of agricultural building. 2006/01841 Erection of extensions, Trelakse Vean, Lewannick Mr P and Mrs C Valvona 2006/01916M Jasmine Cottage, Hicks Mill - Mr E Burrows - Listed Building Consent for the demolition of an existing stone built and slate roof lobby with adjacent wall to existing kitchen and erection of a single storey stone and slate roofed extension off kitchen forming dining area. 2006/01870 Trenhorne Cottage, Trenhorne, Mr N J Smith - Listed Building Consent for the replacement of deteriorated first floor left hand side end of property window with 16 pane single glazed Georgian style

window - application had been withdrawn. Application No 2006/01966 Erection of a dwelling (following demolition of a former agricultural pole barn) and the incorporation of part of the existing domestic curtilage at Darkes Farm as garden area to serve the new dwelling: we have requested a site meeting before making a decision.

Invoices for payment included South West Lumberjacks completing work listed in year 3 Polyphant Green £158.63 and climbing, dismantling and clear up of Sycamore No 66 on 23/24 August £800.06, G Bateman Property Maintenance £32.84 to replace manhole cover and frame on Polyphant Green, audit £141.00 fees for 2006 accounts, David Jones to carry out annual maintenance service of Church Tower Clock £105.75, JRB Enterprise two Dog Waste Bins £368.95, hose and clips to erect dog bin £4.53, Morwellham Sheds and Garden Furniture £200.00 Picnic Table Lewannick Play area, we are also in receipt of payment from Aggregates of £3,435.20 grant for pond Polyphant Green. We awarded a grant of £75 to Lewannick Pre-School as a contribution towards their annual insurance costs.

We will be holding a public meeting on Tuesday 7 November in order to discuss proposed improvements to be carried out on Polyphant Green. The meeting will be held at Polyphant Village Hall commencing 19.30hrs.

Our next ordinary meeting will be held on Wednesday 15 November commencing 20.00hrs at Lewannick Village Hall. Members of the public are always welcome to attend.
