PLANNING APPLICATIONS

It is important for all residents to read pink planning notices put up in the villages (notification also appears in the Cornish & Devon Post).

If you do not agree with a development proposal you must put your objection in writing to the Planning Department, NCDC, 3-5 Barn Lane, Bodmin. PL31 1LZ, with a copy to your Parish Council. The Clerk, Alisa, Medrow, Polyphant. PL15 7PS

It is your responsibility to help us to help you.

More than six written objections must be registered to ensure consideration of a plan by the entire NCDC Planning Committee and thus avoid delegation to a single officer for a decision.

We met at Lewannick on Wednesday 18 April. There were a number of residents present who raised their concerns regarding the development at Darkes Farm, Polyphant. Our Chair and District Councillor were able to reconfirm that the PC had objected to the applications. Residents also raised concerns regarding the speed of traffic passing Kelly's House, Kelly's Cottage etc. It was agreed that we would raise the matter with Highways, our District Councillor and request a site meeting. Residents also mentioned problems in relation to Blackhill Quarry which will be put forward at our next liaison meeting.

Planning which has been approved by NCDC: No 2007/00259 - Mrs M Horrell, Plusha, 2007/00146 J R Fuller Darkes Farm and Mr T Ellis No 2006/02522. We have heard from NCDC confirming that

the Planning history of Darkes Farm is under consideration and that they be contacting us shortly.

Our next meeting will be our Annual General Meeting to take place at Polyphant 19.30hrs on Wednesday 16 May 2007. We invite all organisers of groups that meet within our parish to please let us have a report of their activities or to attend our AGM in order to report same.
