LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met at Lewannick Village Hall on Wednesday 20 February 2008. There were three members of the public present who raised their concerns in respect of planning application 2008/00244. This is for the erection of replacement dwelling following demolition of existing dwelling together with rounding off extension of existing residential cartilage into adjoining field for Trelaske Cottage, application Mr T Z Doak. The application was brought forward to the beginning of our meeting and it was unanimously agreed that the application would not be supported.

We have had notification of road works on A30 Cannafame to Two Bridges including replacing worn carriageway with low noise material, drainage repairs, new safety barriers, road signs and vegetation trimming. Also surface patching and dressing entailing road closures from Medrow to A30 commencing 1 March – we have been assured by Highways that the work will be split into two halves and access will be kept open. Finally the road from Landerslake to Callington Road and Callington Road, Lewannick will be closed for a week from 17 March.

We wrote to Highways expressing our concern over the proposals to remove brown signs for Archer Arms. The Agency replied by sending us copies of the replies they have sent to Graham Facks Martin and Neil Burden. Graham has invited the Area Manager from Highways to a meeting with him, the local MP and other elected representatives and Highways ask us to await the outcome of this meeting.

We have had to carry out work on a tree on Polyphant Green that had a five days notice because it was deemed dangerous with a large split through two-thirds of the tree. The tree has been saved by reducing the crown to a third, the side branches removed and a cobra braced fitted as a shock absorber. The Clerk has also written to various sources for grant funding for a toddlers swing and maybe a climbing frame at Polyphant Green and responses have been received.

A letter from NCDC re the Validation

of Planning Applications in North Cornwall has been received. There is to be a new mandatory standard electronic application form for planning applications which will come into operation on 6 April and NCDC will be required to adopt a list of requirements which must be provided before an application can be validated. There is a proviso that with some applications they will have to exercise discretion as appropriate. There is a copy of the validation requirements for North Cornwall on the NCDC website.

The Revised Supplementary Planning Guidance has been adopted by NCDC.

Finally, planning has been granted for a garage and swimming pool at Bowden Derra.

Invoices were presented for payment from Perfect Pastures £2,441.06 – maintenance of village greens, removing seven tree roots and returfing, maintaining 17 public footpaths and bark chippings for Lewannick Play Area. Polyphant Chapel £33.00 for hiring village hall. We are also responding to a consultation regarding the Aggregates Levy Sustainability Fund for 2008 – 2011 urging that the allocation of funding to communities is continued. We have also submitted a VAT claim £1,376.21.

Our next meeting will be held at Polyphant Village Hall commencing 8pm on Wednesday 19 March 2008. Members of the public are always welcome to attend and, of course, the first ten minutes of each and every meeting is available for residents to bring forward any concerns they may have.

Neighbourhood Policing

We have had community policing for many years but often officers were re-deployed to other duties with little thought for the effect of a lack of police presence in our communities. There is a new initiative to drive all local public services to become more accountable to the communities they serve. Devon and Cornwall Constabulary has a strong tradition of providing Neighbourhood Policing in various forms but is now moving to deliver the service in a more structured manner and achieve nationally mandated standards. The key features of the new service are:

Access - All members of the community will have a means of accessing their Neighbourhood policing Team.

Influence - Communities will be able to influence the activity of the Neighbourhood Team in their area.

Intervention - Co-ordinated action will be taken by Police, Partners and the community to address identified priorities.

Answers - The local community will be informed of activity undertaken in response to their priorities and of the outcome of that activity.

To help with this a process called **PACT** has been developed - **Partners And Communities Together**. This involves gathering information by engaging with the community in a variety of ways which may include public meetings, surgeries, contact with Parish Council and community leaders, street briefings and postcard returns - whichever works best for us. The Beat Manager has a responsibility to make sure these processes are used in one way or another and that communities are kept in touch with the outcome of any activities undertaken.

More information will be made available and PV Nicky Lawson or PCSO Sharon Chin hope to keep in regular contact with us. PACT postcards are now available in the shop at Lewannick which you can use to raise any concerns. A box is provided for collecting these. For more urgent contact tel 08452 777444 or, of course, for emergencies dial 999.
