## Lewannick Parish Council News

We met on Wednesday 16 April at Lewannick Village Hall and were pleased to have in attendance our local MP Dan Rogerson. An outline of the work in progress and local issues affecting our parish was discussed. These included brown signs, adult education, need for post office, playing fields, change of use for businesses, the infra structure, rights of appeal for developers, judicial review and finally first time buyers and affordability of homes within North Cornwall.

As previously mentioned, we now have a report on the trees for Polyphant Green and are waiting for a report from our County Forester, before further progress can be made. We have paid £381.88 to South West Lumberjacks for the removal of the second major limb on the North West side of a mature beech tree on Polyphant Green. This work was carried out due to the weak branch union on the main trunk and was recommended to be carried out under a 5 Day Notice, which had been approved by NCDC, Planning and our County Forester following a recommendation from Bruce Deighton who has surveyed the trees on our behalf.

The Chair handed out Certificates of Attendance awards to Councillors/Clerk following their attendance with regard to the NCDC Code of Conduct Training.

We have written to Highways with regard to the hedgerow growth from Blackhill Quarry to Polyphant and we have written confirmation that this is in hand.

A further Blackhill Quarry Liaison Meeting will be held soon and in this respect we have been in contact with our County Councillor Neil Burden, about the lack of progress with regard to the signage on the A30. He too is frustrated by the lack of progress and we are now writing again to CCC strongly expressing our view point that this requirement on the ROMP agreement is long overdue for implementation. We are also chasing parking outside of the Post Office and the pavement outside the Archer Arms. There is an enormous level of lobbying required in order to progress and improve the services within our parish but that is always our aspiration.

We have received only one planning application, which has been supported, namely 2008/0056 erection of nursery entrance kiosk and covered area. Medrow Bungalow, Medrow, Polyphant, Mr T Ellis.

On 5 May 2008 Cornwall County Council, in partnership with Carrick

District Council and Restormel Borough Council, takes over the enforcement of parking regulations. At the moment this is the job of the police and traffic wardens, but they no longer have the same powers to carry out enforcement. CCC will be responsible for enforcing on-street parking regulations within North Cornwall.

Finally may we again remind you that our Annual General Meeting will be held on Wednesday 21 May commencing 19.00hours. This is a parish meeting and we invite reports from all groups that meet.
