Parish Council News**

Lewannick Parish Council met at Lewannick Village Hall on Wednesday 18 June 2008. The meeting commenced at 20.00 hours. We had invited Dr D Farrar from the Carnewater Practice to speak at the beginning of our meeting. We wish to alert you all of the changes that may have an impact on our community.

The Government have recently published a 'White Paper' on the future of pharmacy services. As well as plans to incorporate pharmacists further into the Community team, the Government is proposing changes to the rules allowing G.P.s to dispense medicines to patients who live more than a mile from a pharmacy. The payments made to dispensing doctors go some way to deferring the costs of rural branch

surgeries. Should some of the proposed changes to the rules around dispensing in the White Paper be implemented, it may make branch surgeries unviable. We urge you to write to our MP Dan Rogerson, Church Stiles, Market Street, Launceston PL15 8AT and the Minister for Health.

Planning application 2008/01095, Erection of side extensions and alterations to existing bungalow Bracken Ridge, Polyphant, Mr James Harris, was supported.

Application 2008/01156, Works to trees in a Conservation Area, namely to remove dead wood and prune, land at Polyphant Green has been submitted and we await the Council's decision. We are also in discussion with NCDC with regard to Darkes Farm. We had one invoice for payment of £22.00 to B J V Cleaning Services for maintenance of the bus shelter, Lewannick. Documents for

consultation included The Boundary Review and NCDC - Ward Profiles.

A red dog bin has been ordered for Trevadlock and it is understood that dog mess is still a real issue within the parish. It is noted that the fines can be heavy, up to £1,000.

Our next meeting is scheduled to take place at Polyphant Village Hall on Wednesday 16 July commencing 20.00 hours.

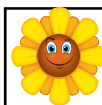
