Lewannick Parish Council News

We met at Polyphant Village Hall on Wednesday 15 October. A liaison meeting with Blackhill Quarry was held on Wednesday 8 October. The wheel wash at the quarry site is working well and there were no issues with regard to the cleanliness off the road immediately outside the quarry. It was agreed that the road surface at the junction with the A30 was becoming worn and broken but not yet dangerous. County Highways have been asked to carry out an inspection. There are concerns with regard to the blast vibration and it is considered that the blast is very loud and a fixed unit on a house in Polyphant had not registered the blast. The blasting contractors are investigating. The overburden removal from the top part of the quarry into the lower workings had been completed for the time being, but further removal and backfilling would take place in the future. This would enable the removal of stock piles from the top levels and relocation in the lower workings.

There will be an open surgery on Tuesday 4 November at Lewannick Village Hall from 16:00hours to 20:00hours by invitation of the parish council to FIRST STEP HOMES. FIRST STEP HOMES has secured a site in the village of Lewannick and you may be aware that an application has been submitted for 18 dwellings which, subject to planning consent, could deliver affordable housing to meet the current local need plus provide available land for the emerging local plan period by local need people who have been already living and working in the Parish for AT LEAST FIVE YEARS or who were born and educated in the Parish, and not the common misconception that the homes will be lived in by anyone from the District who is on the Local Authority Housing Register. We have invited the Company to an open surgery so that residents can drop in and have a chat with the Manager, Martin Page, and his team. Full details of the proposed planning application will be available for inspection together with staff from the Housing Association to answer any queries you may have.

POSTAL SCAM - WARNING

This scam has been confirmed by
Royal Mail. The Trading Standards
Office are making people aware of the
following scam:

A card is posted through your door
from a company called PDS (Parcel
Delivery Service) suggesting that they
were unable to deliver a parcel and that
you need to contact them on 0906
6611911 (a premium rate number). **DO**
NOT call this number, as this is a mail
scam originating from Belize. If you call
the number and you start to hear a
recorded message you will already have
been billed £15 for the phone call!!

If you do receive a card with these
details, then please contact Royal
Mail Fraud on 02072396655 or ICSTIS
(the premium rate service
