Lewannick Parish Council News

Lewannick Parish Council met at Lewannick Village Hall on Wednesday 18 February at 20.00 hours. Planning applications included:

2009/00192 erection of a replacement dwelling incorporating elements of the existing dwelling, TRELASKE MANOR - Mr T Z Doak - which was supported.

2009/00174 Knighton Oak, Plusha retrospective application for Listed Building Consent to rebuild collapsed walls, erection of compressor house, relocate doorway, move fireplace position and extend hallway together with Listed Building Consent for the erection of potting/tools shed/drying bay and greenhouse, plant room (heating and water plant) and 'L' shaped open bay building with stable and workshop - Mr Ian While - again supported.

2009/00172 Erection of a potting shed, greenhouse, and drying bay; erection of a plant room (water purification and eco energy) and erection of an 'L' shaped open bay building with stable and workshop KNIGHTON OAK, PLUSHA, Mr Ian While - which was supported.

2009/00119 Conversion of The Cottage to form a shop on the ground floor with living accommodation on the first floor THE COTTAGE, POLYPHANT Mr David Cash - objection to the lack of parking outside of the proposed shop which would cause conflict with neighbouring properties - not supported.

2009/00080 Trelaske Wood, Mr R O Harvey - Prior Notification for the erection of a timber processing building - supported.

Residents should note that LPC is merely a consultee with respect to planning applications and although our views may be taken into consideration we do pass applications.

The Volunteer Centre, North Cornwall will be operating a bus service from Monday 30 March. It will supply a bus service on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and be available for hire on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. There will be 3 routes initially; to east, south and north of Launceston (one day a week for each area).

It will be a demand responsive service so it will only do what it is asked to do, the itinerary will depend on the number of passengers and where they

live, they will not have to struggle to a bus stop to catch the bus, but anyone wishing to use the bus will need to send their details to be picked up. Email: northcornwall@ccfv.co.uk or telephone 01208 79565 for further information. The Volunteer Centre are also looking for volunteers to help with maintaining the bus, driving, office help, booking, posters, managing a 100 club etc., etc. A meeting will be held at Eagle House Hotel 6pm on Thursday 26 February if you are interested.

We have heard back from Highways regarding precautionary salting. The Highway Steward is aware of our request for precautionary salting from the A30 to Lewannick - because of the school. They will endeavour to make resources available to treat the section highlighted.

We have put in a request for a large pot-hole to be filled on Polyphant Green, drain blocked at Strayer Park and causing flooding onto the road, no turning sign for Medrow and for a turning space just off the A30 to Lewannick to be signposted turning area only on account of safety.

We have sent the deposit cheque to Taylor-Made for the erection of a swing at Polyphant and we are now waiting for this to be installed. Cornwall Countryside Access Forum is currently looking to recruit new members to join the Forum as this year they have 7 vacancies. Finally, we have received complaints regarding dog fouling within the parish. There are a number of waste bins provided by us throughout the parish and we would be grateful if they were used please.

Our next meeting will take place at Polyphant on Wednesday 18 March 20.00hours. As always members of the public are most welcome to attend.

Polyphant Green - our tree surgeon has confirmed dates to carry out the works to the trees as per reports from our County Forester and to which planning permission has been granted, commencing on Friday 20 March and carrying over to Monday 23, 24 and 25 March weather permitting. EDF will also carry out works to trees near overhanging cables.
