## LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met at Polyphant on Wednesday 18 March. The meeting commenced at 8pm. Highways matters were discussed including the condition of Trekelland Bridge which has sadly been hit once more. A special meeting will be held in conjunction with South Petherwin PC, Highways and ourselves on Tuesday 24 March in order to try and find an improved solution for this.

Planning applications which have been supported are 2009/00293 The Warren, Polyphant, Mr and Mrs O Withers. Erection of single storey extension comprising bedroom with en-suite shower room. Full Planning and 2009/00292 3 Springfield, Trevadlock, removal of existing store/study and erection of extension to provide new kitchen/utility and bedroom.

Mr A Brown. For information 2009/00080 Mr R O Harvey - Trelaske Wood, Lewannick - approved. 2009/02355 5 Penmaya House, Bell Meadow, Lewannick - Mr F. Werring - erection of a carport - refused. It should be noted that LPC are merely consultees and do not make any decisions on planning matters.

We are in the process of having the trees at Polyphant Green maintained as per survey and condition reports. We are disappointed that a hornbeam, planted over two years ago, paid for by LPC and professionally planted and staked has been removed. The entire tree, together with support system has been removed to leave no trace of tree or supports. Our next meeting will be held at Lewannick on Wednesday 15 April 2009 commencing 8pm.
