# Lewannick Parish Council News

We met at Lewannick Village Hall on Wednesday 22 September. We are pleased to report that there were six applicants who have applied for co-option onto the council as a result of the vacancy. The co-option will take place by ballot during the course of our next meeting scheduled for Wednesday 20 October at Polyphant Village Hall.

Planning applications for discussion included Application PA1/04241 Alteration and extension to form 1) side utility room, 2) rear conservatory, 3) conversion of existing garage into an annexe, 4) form rooms within loft area, 5) erection of new rear garage, 6) demolish existing front garage - Shildon, Polyphant, Launceston, Mr Mark Shillaber - supported. POA10/05486 Construction of two double garages with storerooms, Trelaske Manor, Lewannick, Launceston, Mr T Doak supported. PA10/05333 Side extension to provide lobby and utility room, 17 Serpells Meadow, Polyphant, Launceston, Mr and Mrs Keith Dawes - supported. Applications for information:- E1/2010/00312, Mr T Z Doak, Trelaske Manor, Grant of Conditional Planning Permission, construction of replacement dwelling. PA10/03801, Mrs M Kemp, extension to existing school to form new foundation unit -Grant of Conditional Planning Permission.

We have now received recommendation for approval from CC for works to the trees on Polyphant Green. We would like to incorporate a Lime Tree within our future plans. However, we are concerned about the escalating costs involved with the on-going maintenance of the green. Therefore, we are putting out a request to establish if any resident(s) would like to donate a lime tree for Polyphant Green. Please email the clerk elaine@lewannickpc.f9.co.uk if you would like to make this enduring gift to the community.

CC have notified us with respect to the provision and maintenance of salt bins (proposals for future arrangements). CC recognise the importance of salt bins to local communities and is keen to support all town and parish councils that wish to see the salt bins retained within their community. However, there are over 400 highway salt bins throughout Cornwall, which incur an estimated annual cost of £20,000 to manage and maintain. The proposal for 2010/11 for bins which are presently sited contrary to national best practice will be removed, together with those bins which have clearly served no purpose for some time due to their poor condition or location. The Council also resolved that it will continue to maintain the existing retained salt bins as usual in 2010/11, including the provision of salt, but will not provide any new salt bins on the highway. Any new bins that need to be provided, filled and maintained will be at LPC's cost. This reflects the severe financial constraints the Council faces, which impacts on the ability to maintain discretionary provision such as salt bins. We are being invited to take full responsibility for all salt bins within our area from 2011/12 and beyond. If we are not prepared to take responsibility the bins would

be removed some time after winter 2010/11. This will naturally have a knock-on effect with respect to the preparation of our precept for 2011/12 and beyond. We have, of course, voiced our formal views on the proposal to CC and our County Councillor.

Cheques were made out to J Potter £9.81 (refuse sacks, Polyphant Play Area), Cumbria Clock Company £152.75 (on-going maintenance of parish clock), Audit Commission £158,63 (auditing of our affairs for the year to 31 March 2010), Perfect Pastures £848.94 (second payment of our maintenance contract) and a grant of £150.00 to Lewannick Pre-School Community Project.

Finally our Parish Plan is in place but needs updating. We will be holding a meeting on Wednesday 13 October at Lewannick Village Hall commencing 19.30. The Plan is important – it will affect where and how your precept monies are spent. We would welcome support from the community and hope that many of you will be able to attend this meeting in order to set up a group to develop and improve our future Plan.

Our next ordinary meeting is scheduled for Wednesday 20 October at 20.00 hours at Polyphant Village Hall.

The police will continue to email Jenny Potter and myself to advise us of current news. The 08452 777444 number can be rung to report incidents other than criminal actions, such as road traffic offences or domestic violence, or any matter which the caller wants to discuss with the police. Whatever the cause of the call, the police will advise the caller and, if action is to take place, once again the caller must get the log number and date.
