## Lewannick Outdoor Community Classroom

The partnership of Lewannick Preschool, Lewannick CP School and Lewannick Parish Council are pleased to announce that the Outdoor Community Classroom is now in the process of being built.

The project is part financed by the European Agricultural Fund for European Development 2007-2013: Europe investing in rural areas and is being delivered through the Local Action For Rural Communities Programme by the East Cornwall Local Action Group on behalf of the South West of England Regional Development Agency, with Defra as the Managing Authority.

This is an exciting opportunity for our community and has been made possible by the generous donations by a number of local organisations and businesses including: Horizon Home Improvements, Westward Housing Group, Community Chest Fund, Lewannick Preschool, Lewannick Parish Council and Lewannick CP School, as well as all those who bought Christmas Draw tickets.

During the application process a number of community groups supported our application by expressing interest in using this facility. The Outdoor Classroom space will be available to book for use outside of School hours via Lewannick CP School, with bookings being placed on a monthly timetable. It is hoped that the structure will be completed by April 2011.

## LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met at Lewannick Village Hall on Wednesday 16 February. The meeting commenced at 8pm.

The notice board situated at Lewannick is being sent back to the manufacturers to rectify the problem of condensation within the unit.

We have received letters from residents who wish to apply for an allotment within walking distance of Lewannick Village. If any other residents are interested can they kindly let us know. This is, of course, subject to the availability of ground and we would be keen to hear from any land owners who may wish to rent or sell land for the use of an allotment association.

We are pleased to learn that the door to the telephone kiosk in Lewannick should be replaced by BT by the end of February.

A site meeting with Phil Parsons (County Councillor) and Oliver Jones (Highways) has taken place at Polyphant in order to review the problem of the road surface at the junction of Medrow/Polyphant Green and erosion of the road surface by the flow of water. We have now had confirmation from Highways that the matter is being investigated further. We have also reported various potholes to Highways.

Planning applications for consideration were PA10/0510 Proposed new vehicular access drive, parking for ten vehicles and a single storey extension to form new entrance lobby and office – Pen-Inney House, Ladybrook Care Homes Ltd. Supported. PA11/00156 Construction of a single dwelling. Land adjoining Cottage Garden, Lewannick, Mr A J Downing. Supported. PA10/08830 Construction of a new single family dwelling with associated car parking bays to road frontage. Pen-Inney Cottage, Mr David Eno. Supported. It must be noted that Mr David Eno left the room while PA10/08830 was under discussion.

We had one invoice for payment, namely Lewannick Village Hall £48 for the hire of hall with respect to parish meetings.

It is a concern that litter is becoming a problem again throughout our parish and the team of Litter Pickers hope to begin tackling the situation in the near future. Naturally it is hoped that all residents will continue to assist in keeping our parish litter free.

We are saddened that dog fouling is still a serious concern, especially within Lewannick and the footpath from Hawks Tor to Lewannick Primary School.

Our next meeting is scheduled to take place at Polyphant Village Hall on Wednesday 16 March and will commence at 20.00 hours. Members of the public are always welcome to join us.
