## Lewannick Parish Council News

We held our Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 18 May at 19.30 at Lewannick Village Hall. Reports were received and read from on behalf of Polyphant Ladies' Club, Lewannick Parish Website, Film Society, Amateur Dramatic Society and Lewannick Village Hall. These reports prove to be immensely helpful to the council and help to assist in determining how and where funding needs to be placed and, of course, assists in welding the parish together.

The financial report confirmed that we have a healthy balance in hand of £7,796.74. Our expenditure for the year ending 31 March 2011 was £12,908.26 (£16,156.00 in 2010) with an income of £5,000 from the Aggregates Levy and Precept of £12,000. One of our major overhead costs is the maintenance of Lewannick and Polyphant Greens which amounted to £3,251.87 last year.

We appreciate very much the generous assistance from the local care home on taking on the maintenance of the green. They have complied with all the health and safety requirements and public liability.

The Chairman gave a resume of the events throughout the year and explained that the cuts being made would have a big impact on our Parish. Services are going to be cut or removed which will put pressure on communities to find alternatives and to lobby against the cuts. The Localism Charter expects that the community will have to do more for itself and help others. Next year we are going to have to fill our own grit bins and pay out of the precept but as a Council we are still going forward with projects. The automation of the Parish clock was a big investment (paid for by the Aggregate fund).

The two housing developments have been completed with Harpers Meadow nearly fully occupied; Beacon View has started to have people moving in. Our County Councillor, with our support, has been trying to under occupy some of the Beacon View homes for two persons occupancy. This would address the local need but we have been unsuccessful.

Our attempts to get the Parish Plan off the ground are proving quite difficult and we are considering other options to get the data required to compile the plan. The Lewannick play area regeneration has had a good start with input from the children and parents being collected and money from the Mayday celebrations going towards it. The foot/cycle path is going to face a funding issue but with local support this is an achievable project. The increase in pedestrians due to the two new housing estates will make this project a very important one which will take people away from the nasty bends by the church. We will have a challenging year to come but working together and with the support from the community we can still achieve a lot.

Following the Annual Parish Meeting we held our Ordinary Meeting. During that meeting grant funding to various organisations within the parish were considered and grants were made to the following organisations:-

Lewannick Church, Lewannick Village Hall, Lewannick Amateur Society, Lewannick Parish Website, Polyphant Church and Trevadlock Cemetery. We had one invoice for payment, namely Cornwall Association of Local Councils £254.86 our subscription fees for the year. We also received correspondence from residents at Polyphant with respect to a proportion of Polyphant Green.

There was one planning application for consideration PA11/02172 Variation of Condition No.3 on Decision Notice 97/1902 to allow year round occupation of the chalets, Units 1 and 2, Trevadlock Hall Park, Lewannick, Launceston, Mr Michael Vowles. We have not supported this application, namely because it is considered that the dwellings do not meet current building regulations.

Councillors have been invited to a Renewable Energy Conference and Exhibition on 28 and 29 July 2011.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday 15 June 2011 commencing at our usual starting time of 20.00 hours. As always members of the public are very welcome to join us.

### DEVON AND CORNWALL POLICE AUTHORITY NEWS

In October/November 2010 the Devon and Cornwall Police Authority held a number of meetings across Cornwall asking members of the public what they thought made a successful police force. The answer they got was that visibility of the police is a hugely important issue. If people cannot see the police they tell us they feel less safe, less confident that the police will respond to calls and exposed to anti-social behaviour.

As a result the Authority has made visibility one of the things we expect to be improved and which they will monitor. So, from April 2011, one of the targets the Police have to assure us they are meeting (or exceeding) is that "at least 36% of people say they see the police on foot patrol in the local area at least once a fortnight". This initially may not seem like a particularly challenging target but in 2006 visibility was recorded as only 12%. Additionally, this will not capture those that see officers at meetings or in cars or responding to calls, so in reality the "total visibility" will be higher.
