Lewannick Parish Council

This month our meeting took place at Polyphant Village Hall on 20 March 2013. We are pleased to confirm that we now have the necessary planning permission to carry out the work to the trees on Polyphant Green. Application number PA13/00536. We now invite interested parties to please contact us for a tender pack by emailing elaine@lewannickpc.f9.co.uk. We are in the process of a consultation process with respect to The Cornwall Local Plan – Strategic Policies pre-submission document which contains the council’s planning policies and proposals to direct, manage and influence development over the period to 2030. Representations are sought on whether the Local Plan is sound. Subject to the outcome of this consultation, this is the Local Plan that Cornwall Council intends to submit to the Secretary of State for examination. Also The Draft Gypsy and Travelling Communities Strategy and Delivery Plan provides the evidence base for the Draft Local Plan policy for Gypsies and Travellers. It identifies pitch requirements to 2020, sets out the Council’s priorities for delivery of sites, and includes information on funding, site design and site management. It does not allocate specific sites for Gypsy and Traveller use, nor includes site specific policies and 3 The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Preliminary Draft Charging schedule forms the first formal step towards adopting a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) for Cornwall. CIL is a means of collecting contributions from developments to help pay towards infrastructure. The consultation document explains the CIL and sets out the proposed CIL charges. The documents can be viewed at www.cornwall.gov.uk/localplancornwall. The documents are also available for inspection at Cornwall Council One Stop Shops during normal office hours and Cornwall Libraries. Responses to each of the documents referred to can be returned to Cornwall Council, Local Plan Team, Carrick House, St Clement Street, TRURO TR1 1EB or email localplan@cornwall.gov.uk. We would very much like to receive your responses as the local plan will affect Lewannick parish. We have applied for grant funding with respect to a proposed bus shelter installation at Lewannick. The proposed shelter would be a two bay transit 2 style shelter with seat (as per shelter at Pennygillam, Launceston). We had a number of invoices for payment:- £2,182.00 Schoolscapes – Lewannick Play Park, Landlake Sawmills £2,760.80 – Lewannick Play Park, Play Safety £474.00 – Rospra Report – Lewannick Play Park; Newsletter £300 and finally £900 for maintenance of our footpaths. We have been in liaison with Highways with regard to the pot holes in the parish. Our next meeting is scheduled to take place at Lewannick Village Hall on Wednesday 17 April 20.00 hours. Members of the public are always welcome to attend our meetings.

Restoration of the old road from Lewannick to South Petherwin

Last year South Petherwin parishioners took part in a Parish Walk as part of the Diamond Jubilee Celebrations. On a damp Sunday afternoon in May, an intrepid group of walkers followed the ancient track-way from South Petherwin through Trethevy and Treguddick, arriving at Lewannick. The walk proved challenging from beginning to end, with drainage, resurfacing and tree maintenance work required at Trethevy and likewise on the climb up to Lewannick. It was felt that it would be a great idea to work on a joint parish 'restoration' project for the 'old road' to make it easier to walk and possibly cycle. Phil Parsons has since made contact with residents at Lewannick including David Eno, John Newbury and Parish Clerk Elaine Cook who welcomed the proposal with a similar project already in mind. The track-way was one of the items on the agenda for Lewannick History Group on 18th March, being an ancient cart track between farms, villages and mills, including Treguddick Mill and quarry and Treguddick Manor. Any information, memories or photographs connected with the track would be welcome.

Both David and Phil would like to invite 'Petherwin' and 'Lewannick' parishioners to a joint meeting to see what interest there is in pursuing this restoration project on **Monday 8th April, 7:30pm** at Lewannick Village Hall.
