A Microlibrary for the Parish?

The Library Van service to Lewannick and Polyphant is set to cease in the near future and Launceston Library hours are likely to be cut even further. Cornwall Council are promoting an alternative scheme where local communities set up their own 'microlibraries'. These are run under the umbrella of Cornwall Council in public buildings such as village halls. They consist of two or three shelving units which are serviced monthly by a delivery van from the central library. Part of the setup includes a computer which can be used to view the lending library catalogue, plus many other resources, and for ordering any books of your choice. It's not necessary for borrowers to be able to use the computer as someone should be present to help.

A limited number of grants of £1000 are available to help finance the setup costs which include shelving, computer, signage etc. I have registered our interest with Cornwall Council but whether this goes ahead or not depends on you and what you want. We would have to guarantee to keep the microlibrary open for at least six hours per week. We would need volunteer 'librarians' to cover the opening hours. The system is mainly paper based and works on trust, but it would be essential to have somebody to do the very simple computer administration from time to time.

The possible venues would be Lewannick Village Hall or Polyphant Chapel, or both, but they prefer other services such as book swaps not to be run on the same premises

There is the possibility of making this a community social event with tea and coffee available while the library is open - a sort of Library Cafe. For this we'd probably need two people to be present at the same time. Free library membership also entitles users at home to access Cornwall Library Service's wide range of subscriptions to online newspapers, magazines and specialist information services.

If you think this sounds like a good idea please register your support (see below) and if you fancy being a 'librarian' or a helper and would be willing to commit some time every week, that would be even better.
