Lewannick Parish Council

Lewannick Parish Council met at Polyphant on Wednesday 20 January 2016.

There were two planning applications for discussion, namely:-

PA15/10051 installation of an asphalt batching plant, hot storage, Blackhill Quarry, Polyphant which has not been supported and

PA15/10030 erect new entrance to give access to the fields for tenant farmer. Land South East of Beacon View, Lewannick which has been supported.

Invoices for payment included Launceston Print Ltd £180.00 for the printing of our newsletters. Nathan Pearson £50.00 for the tree removal, Polyphant, R Morley £51.00 - cleaning of bus shelters, Lewannick and Darren Humber £360.00 for maintenance of play area, common land and Hawks Tor verge, Lewannick.

Four drainage odour - Polyphant - is being recorded.

Free Home Fire Safety Checks from Cornwall Fire and Rescue Service

Cornwall Fire and Rescue Service has an ongoing initiative and commitment to provide free home fire safety checks to households across Cornwall. A representative from CFRS would make an appointment with the occupier who has requested a visit and carry out a survey of the property with regards to fire risk giving necessary advice and fitting smoke alarms if needed. This is a free service.

The smoke alarms that they supply and fit have a 10 year life battery that does not require changing, they have a large test button which can also silence the alarm if it were to go off with cooking fumes. So these new alarms are much easier than the older style ones.

There have been several severe fires recently in isolated properties in rural areas.
